Eight Med-Ed (Medical Education) students are the first in the state of Kentucky to earn the National Work Readiness Credential (WRC) – Tonya Battle, Sabrina Gritton, Jennifer Hall, Sonja Hardy, Amy Johnson, Karla Perrin, Lakeisha Stone, and Ericka Webster.

Med-Ed is a 12-week medical and office training course offered through a joint partnership between the Community Action Partnership (CAP) and Jefferson County Public Schools Adult and Continuing Education (JCPSACE). JCPSACE is one of the 50 sites nationwide involved with the soft launch of the WRC.

The WRC credential assesses skills in reading, math, problem solving, and communications. It is designed to provide a portable, national certification affirming that individual job seekers have demonstrated the knowledge and skills needed for successful performance as entry-level workers.
